


Sunday, December 20 – Advent 4

A: Do you know what time it is?
L: Finally, time to light the last advent candle!
A: That's right! This week is the last Sunday of Advent! That means we are lighting the
 candle of LOVE.
L: Don't forget, there's a pandemic happening. No kissing!
A: Well, that's one kind of love. When we talk about the candle of love, we are
 remembering God's love for us. God loved us so much that God gave us the greatest gift
 of all time: Jesus!

L: Jesus *is* an amazing gift because Jesus is the gift that keeps giving. Jesus gives mercy, forgiveness, and grace... all because of love!

A: And this love isn't just for you and me. It is for everyone and for all time. This is the promise of Jesus' death and resurrection.

L: That's a pretty awesome gift!

A: When we light the candle of love, we are lighting up love in our hearts and in our lives so that we can, not just experience God's love, but share it with others, too.

name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' ²⁹But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' ³⁴Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' ³⁵The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God.' ³⁸Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.
