<u>Word</u>

First Reading: Acts 16:16-34 Reader – Bill Neeb

Info: The owners of a slave girl who used her powers to tell fortunes threw Paul and Silas into prison for "healing" her and, consequently, ruining their business. In prison, Paul and Silas sing of their faith and they bring the story of Jesus to a jailer and his family.

¹⁶⁻¹⁸ One day, on our way to the place of prayer, a slave girl ran into us. She was a psychic and, with her fortunetelling, made a lot of money for the people who owned her. She started following Paul around, calling everyone's attention to us by yelling out, "These men are working for the Most High God. They're laying out the road of salvation for you!" She did this for a number of days until Paul, finally fed up with her, turned and commanded the spirit that gripped her, "Out! In the name of Jesus Christ, get out of her!" And it was gone, just like that.

¹⁹⁻²² When her owners saw that their lucrative little business was suddenly bankrupt, they went after Paul and Silas, roughed them up and dragged them into the market square. Then the police arrested them and pulled them into a court with the accusation, "These men are disturbing the peace—subverting our Roman law and order."

²²⁻²⁴ The judges had Paul and Silas's clothes ripped off and ordered a public beating. They threw them into jail, telling the jailkeeper to put them under heavy guard so there would be no chance of escape.

²⁵⁻²⁶ Along about midnight, Paul and Silas were at prayer and singing a hymn to God. The other prisoners couldn't believe their ears. Then, without warning, a huge earthquake! The jailhouse tottered, every door flew open, all the prisoners were loose.

²⁷⁻²⁸ Startled from sleep, the jailer saw all the doors swinging loose on their hinges. Assuming that all the prisoners had escaped, he pulled out his sword and was about to turn it on himself, figuring he was as good as dead anyway, when Paul stopped him: "Don't do that! We're all still here! Nobody's run away!"

²⁹⁻³¹ The jailer got a torch and ran inside. Badly shaken, he collapsed in front of Paul and Silas. He led them out of the jail and asked, "Sirs, what do I have to do to be saved, to really live?" They said, "Put your entire trust in the Master Jesus. Then you'll live as you were meant to live—and everyone in your house included!"

³²⁻³⁴ They went to the Jailer's house and told in detail the story of Jesus—the Jailer's entire family listened. The jailer made them feel at home, dressed their wounds, and then was baptized, he and everyone in his family. There in his home, he had food set out for a festive meal.
